Experience the thrill of flight with the MAAA!

Experience the thrill of flight at an MAAA club. Take a look at the types of model aircraft you can pilot and the categories of flying you can enjoy.

Radio Control

RC Models have revolutionised aeromodelling. RC aircraft are operated remotely by a hand-held radio transmitter and can be bought “off-the-shelf” from a local hobby shop. For many flyers this category offers the ultimate in excitement with models ranging from helicopters to scale models (like the spitfire) or even acrobatic and racing models. RC is challenging, exciting and lots of fun. But it's not as easy as it appears, don't lose heart if at first you don't succeed. Join a local club to get the best flying tips.

Free Flight

Free flight is the oldest form of model flying. It offers fun and exercise in the open. With models ranging from gliders to rubber powered and diesel or glo-plug engine types they are built from plans or kit sets. Gliders can be launched by a towline or hand launched with a pair of fast feet.

After release they are free to soar in the rising air currents. Rubber powered models are popular both as a competition class and for sport flying.

Control Line

Control line (often abbreviated to CL) is the original 'remote control' where a model aircraft is flown within a hemisphere by a pilot holding a handle that is connected to the model's mechanical control system via two thin steel cables. Control line offers the possibility of aerobatics, racing and even duelling in a deadly streamer chopping bout with models powered by either diesel or glo-plug engines.

Indoor Flying

With the advent of powerful lightweight batteries for electric motors, interest is growing in indoor flight. You can fly a wide range of aircraft including aerobatic, scale WWII and helicopter models indoors.
